NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED

n September 24th, sixteen people welcomed Julia back in our midst to begin a five week sermon series on "Love." Julia titled this week's message "Crazy Little Thing Called Love (All You Need Love)" and asked us "What is love?" which is difficult to

define. Using the scripture 1 Corinthians 13:1-7 we heard how the apostle Paul described agape love to the Corinthians as among other aspects as patient, kind, not envious or boastful. This then causes us to reflect on Jesus' two commandments to love God and love our neighbour as ourselves. For this love draws people in. This agape love defined in the epistle does not come naturally to us but when we experience it there is a calm within as our hearts are opened. In the order of service in this sermon series there is a question for connection and this week's question was "From whom in your life have you felt the greatest love?" And so I ask what is your answer to this question?

Then on October 1st (is it October already?) eighteen people joined Julia as she continued her sermon series on love entitling her message "Just the Way You Are." Using the scripture from 1 John 4:7-5:3, we heard that God's love is expressed through Jesus who became flesh. We do not see God but as we experience Jesus we realize within ourselves that God's love is real and that God loves us just as we are. In a couple of moments during Julia's message we were asked to turn to one another and as we looked into one another's eyes say to that one "You are loved" and then later as we looked at one another again say "I am lovable." Which was the most difficult to say to others? For do we not love God as we love others and to love others we proclaim that indeed we are loveable. Which brings me to the Question for Connection "How do you understand God's love for you and how do you express that in your life?" And so I ask how do you answer this question?

I wonder what we will hear next about Love in Julia's sermon series?


