NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED


Thanksgiving Sunday, October 8th, saw twenty-six people join Julia for her third in the series on Love. She titled her message "This Is Me" and read from Paul's letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 3:16-20) where we are described as God's temple. She inquired whether we describe ourselves

as being a glass half full or a glass half empty for until we love ourselves we cannot really love others. Today's question for connection asked "What do you need or what do you require to love yourself?" To see ourselves as lovable, we require to really look inward with no distractions and we may even require help to speak our own truth. As we bring our whole selves to God we do so with integrity from which thanksgiving comes. What do you personally need to love yourself in order to say "I am lovable?"

On October 15th twenty people gathered with Julia for the fourth in her sermon series on Love. Her message was entitled "Count on Me" and her question for connection was "How did people best care for you?" (I know this because I asked Julia before the service since we did not receive bulletins.) She read from Romans 13:8-10 which says in part "any other commandment are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbour as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law." (verses 9b-10 NRSV) As part of her message, Julia asked us to spend a few minutes talking with and listening to one other person talk about their life (three minutes each). We ended with this thought – may we be the community of faith known as a community that loves one another.

A reminder: as October 29th is the fifth Sunday of the month there will be no service at St. Andrew's United that Sunday. Plan to attend the joint service and potluck with Okotoks United, United Church in the Valley, and ourselves at Okotoks United at 10:45.


