2025 OUC Charitable Tax Receipts

Yes it is that special time of year!

We want to bring you an update on how your 2025 Charitable Tax Receipts will be distributed. For 2025, there are two parts to this.

First, remember way back in March of 2025 we issued you traditional paper copies of your tax receipt covering only the months of January and February 2025? This was a result of the Canada Post strike and the Government of Canada's decision to allow you to claim donations for those months on either your 2024 or 2025 tax return. You have hopefully tucked this first receipt safely into your tax file.

Second, we will be delivering your Charitable Tax Receipt for March through December 2025 electronically. If we have your email address on file, you will receive your tax receipt in your inbox during the week of February 10th. This will be a confidential email solely to you and will be sent from the Church office email. This is a new process for us so we ask for your patience. There quite possibly will be some hiccups and we will address these as quickly as we can. If we have your correct email on file, then things should proceed smoothly. If we have the wrong email on file, we will need to do some work. If we do not have your email address on file we will prepare a paper tax receipt that you will be able to pick up after worship beginning February 15th.

We are currently reviewing our database to update email addresses based on the addresses Traci uses for this newsletter. We will run the receipts once this update has been complete.

We will send out a broadcast email to let you know when to expect your email tax receipt, or if you are receiving a paper tax receipt, we will confirm when and where you can pick it up. After the tax receipts have been issued you can contact Traci in the office if there is an error in your receipt or if you did not receive one in any format.

Thanks so much for your patience and support in making this change.

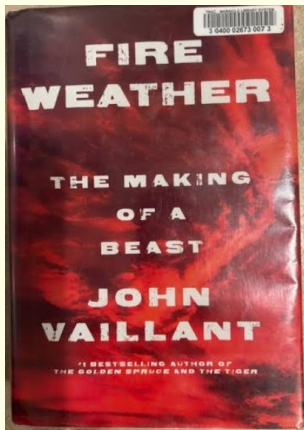
